22/057 BRITISH RED CROSS UKRAINE CRISIS APPEAL: (Councillor Blundell resumed the Chair)

There was a discussion regarding the humanitarian crisis in the Ukraine and the number of refugees expected to increase to 4 million. It is the biggest human exodus since WW2 and will add to the global pandemic in Europe. £100 will provide 2 families with emergency rations for a month.

It was resolved to contribute £500 to the Red Cross Ukraine Appeal.

22/059 QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE CELEBRATION:

The Council was informed that a Scarisbrick celebration will not be taking place and, therefore, funding would not be required.

^{*} NB Items 5 and 6 were approved for purchase at the SPC February meeting and required payment in advance before the goods could be manufactured/despatched. They have been included on the March Finance List for completeness but are included on the February Bank Statement.

22/060 SPC WORKING GROUPS PROGRESS REPORTS:

ROAD TRAFFIC WORKING GROUP:

Meeting minutes were noted.

The distribution of speed stickers to the initial planned addresses has progressed well. The distribution will continue during March to deliver to all properties on Southport Road (30mph and 40mph areas). All remaining stickers will be brought to the April meeting so that further distribution can be planned.

Councillor Herbert provided a verbal update on SPID proposal progress. There has been a lack of response from Lancashire County Council (LCC) and this has stalled progress significantly as all available options revolve around their response.

The revenue cost to charge and move battery operated SPIDs is approx £5k per year. The capital costs of solar SPIDs will be increased but should reduce revenue costs by approx. 50%.

At the time that LCC attended for a site visit there was not a problem with the existing SPIDS or columns as the initial intention was to instal battery operated SPIDS. Although these are still an option the current proposal is for solar SPIDS which, although costlier to purchase, will require less intervention as charging will not be regularly required. However, solar powered SPIDs are heavier and more wind resistant than battery SPIDs which means that the existing columns are not suitable.

LCC have been asked to advise on the installation of stronger columns and their response is now urgently required so that progress can be made.

It was resolved that Councillor Makin and Councillor Herbert contact LCC to seek their response. Councillor J Marshall will contact the LCC portfolio holder to request assistance.

MILLENNIUM WOOD WORKING GROUP

Meeting minutes were noted. It was also noted that a quotation for groundworks required to the entrance at the rear of the Wood to make disabled access possible is awaited. The discussion continued into the following agenda item.

22/061 MILLENNIUM WOOD – VANDALISM:

There was further discussion concerning the recent vandalism of the kissing gate and its replacement, by persons unknown, with a completely unsuitable metal farm type gate which is hanging open and permitting access to horses, cyclists, and motor bikes. The Wood is for pedestrian access only but is now open to all.

The matter has been reported to the police and a crime reference number obtained. The insurance company has been contacted and their response is awaited.

It was resolved that:

Pedestrian access to Millennium Wood should be continued

Clerk to obtain a quotation for new metal fencing across the rear boundary of the Wood and a new metal kissing gate be obtained to restore pedestrian only access. This should

also include a disabled access option that can be operated with an appropriate radar key.

Clerk to arrange for signage to be installed stating no horses, no bicycles and no motorbikes are permitted in the Woods and that dogs must be kept on a lead.

22/062 PENSIONS POLICY:

It was resolved to approve the Pensions Policy. Clerk to take necessary actions

22/063 FLOOD EQUIPMENT SHOPPING LIST:

Enquiries had been made regarding potential storage areas for flood equipment but some responses are outstanding. The proposed high security storage sheds will require to be delivered directly to site for installation.

It was resolved that responses be chased up and that this will be included on the SPC April agenda

22/064 SPC FACEBOOK:

Councillor Berks advised that the SPC Facebook page is now up and running and that there needed to be a unified approach to content.

The Facebook can be linked to the SPC website and news items could be placed on Facebook rather than the website.

It was resolved that Councillors should join the Facebook group so they can be elevated to administrators and able to post content.

22/065 MERSCAR/DRUMMERSDALE JUNCTION:

The response received from LCC Highways was discussed. LCC strategy is to target locations where there can be a demonstrable impact on reducing casualty figures. They do not attempt to prevent accidents before they happen.

It was resolved that Councillor C Marshall will respond to LCC Highways with concerns about the lack of signage at the junction.

22/066 2022 CIVIC SERVICE:

Rev Heaney has suggested Sunday 15th May 2022 (which is the beginning of Christian Aid Week) for the Civic Service to be held at St Marks. There will be a brass band in attendance and the collection could support Christian Aid.

It was resolved that the suggested date be accepted, and that the Council would support the refreshments in the sum of £150.

Clerk to contact Rev Heaney and also to send out invitations to West Lancashire Parish Council chairpersons, the Mayor, and other local organisations (Councillors to provide further details to assist with this)

22/067 2022 SCARISBRICK GARDENING COMPETITION:

Councillor Makin advised that she is working on this and will provide further information at the SPC April meeting.

It was resolved that this item should be included on the SPC April meeting agenda

22/068 S106 SVH PROPOSED PLAYGROUND RESIDENT CONSULTATION:

It was resolved that the consultation should be uploaded to the SPC Facebook page and displayed on parish noticeboards so that the views of residents could be taken into consideration if S106 funding is made available.

22/069 SPC CREDIT/CHARGE CARD APPLICATION:

It was resolved to suspend the application and that the Clerk should investigate alternative options.

22/070 CLERKS REPORT: FOR INFORMATION:

The Clerk's report was noted.

22/071 COUNCILLORS REPORTS AND ITEMS FOR FUTURE AGENDAS:

Councillor J Marshall requested that internal audit arrangements for the 2022/23 financial year be included on April agenda.

Councillor C Berks advised that the old phone box on Smithy Lane is available to purchase.
